Through PWNA's Produce service, fresh fruits and vegetables are distributed to hundreds of households in tribal communities. Our Program Partner Deb facilitated an Ancestral Produce Distribution on the Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota, which included bison meat along with fresh produce to create healthy meals at home.

One produce recipient was Charlotte who serves as guardian to 6-year-old Taeton. Charlotte shared, *"PWNA brings hope, balance, and empowerment to my life. Thank you, thank you, thank you!"*

GRANT UPDATE

With grant funding from General Motors, our 2023 cohort of 4D (Four Directions Development Program) participants began wrapping up their six months of leadership training in both the Northern Plains and Southwest. Twenty-three participants have completed or will be completing the training series soon, including four in-person sessions, virtual meetings with keys/mentors, and self-study to reach personal and professional development goals. This is the 8th cohort of Native leaders to graduate from the program, bringing their new skills, contacts, and knowledge back to their homes and reservations to grow and build their communities.
