Housing needs remain critical for Native families on tribal lands where shortages and overcrowding persist. Program Partner Pamela in Birney, Montana helps her community by operating a shelter for homeless men. She receives hygiene and cleaning supplies through PWNA's Residential service to maintain the shelter and help residents like 48-year-old Felix.

Felix volunteers as the shelter caretaker, cleaning the facility, tending the garden, and cooking meals for himself and other residents. Felix shared that it's hard to find work locally, so he's grateful for supplies. *"I very much appreciate it. It really helps, especially with no job - I can't afford it myself. There aren't a lot of resources around here."*

GRANT UPDATE

In September 2023, PWNA received a \$100,000 commitment from the Synchrony Foundation to fund two years of scholarships, laptops, and backpacks for AIEF scholarship recipients. Over the course of two years, this funding will help AIEF provide 30 scholarships of \$2,000 each to Native student scholars attending an undergraduate or graduate degree program, along with 20-24 laptops and backpacks for freshmen students who otherwise cannot afford these items for their first year of school. With the support from Synchrony Foundation since 2021, AIEF has been able to provide dozens of scholarships to Native American scholars from across the United States, improving graduation outcomes and the lives of each scholar benefitting from the foundation’s gift.
